DELEGATION(S)

Darryl Hutchings presented a written submission to Council. Hutchings gave his professional history and background. He discussed his love of the community and concern about the current vision of Council. The presentation also included discussion about: governance, policy, the church and state relationship in Stirling, development, sustainability in a tighter budget climate and promoting Stirling. Hutchings asked Council to look at the Alberta Southwest project to assess municipalities. The study is being done by Twist Marketing based on the Doug Griffiths book "13 Ways to Kill a Community".

Library Board member T.J. Fletcher requested Council designate the old Council room space as Library space. He also introduced the speaking order for the presentation.

Librarian Laura Quinton discussed current Library programming and limitations due to lack of space. She also spoke about future services that could be provided with access to additional room. Quinton added the Library has out grown their space.

ChickLit Reading Club representative Pietsie Rijpstra told Council her group currently meets once a month and is looking for a space more open to the public to meet.

Doug Cooper spoke on behalf of the Historical Society. He indicated the group is looking for a historical reference area where people can come and find material and research the history of their ancestors from Stirling. He spoke about the need for space to have computers and displays set up.

Library Board member Crystal Wilde spoke about opportunities available to the youth through additional Library programming. She indicated additional space would allow for the Library Board

Fletcher summarized the group's presentations by indicating the Library would be able to offer more programming to the community with the additional space. He then asked again for Council to formally designate the old Council area as Library space.
