ANIMAL BYLAW
No. 363-96 REVIEW HORSES

Councillor Maynes presented 5 proposed changes to the current Animal Bylaw No. 363-96. The proposed changes are outlined in the Draft Proposed Changes Bylaw No. 363-96 document.

Council directed administration to bring forward a draft bylaw with the proposed changes and amendments included.

DELEGATION(S)

Larry Nilsson presented on behalf of 6 residents who had concerns about the swimming pool "family season pass" not being available to grandparents to take grandchildren anymore. Nilsson gave a history of when and why this type of pass was available. This included the idea of passes being sold to grandparents to generate revenue to help keep the pool from closing one summer. He spoke about the revenue grandparents bring t the pool each year from passes and lessons. Nilsson also discussed other processes that could be implemented to help with the loss of possible revenue.

Council put forward the idea of "senior punch card" option.

Nilsson and the other delegation members offered feedback.

WATER CONSUMPTION YTD

Administration presented information on the Village water consumption for the 2015 year including up to June 15 of this month. The number show water consumption for the month of June will be more than double the 2014 monthly usage and that daily consumption levels continue to climb. Administration indicated this trend will require the Village to purchase more water than budgeted for 2015 and will lead to an increase in the water flat rate component of the monthly utility bill.

Council discussed how to help residents become aware of the increased water usage, the potential for a price increase to water rates and how the Village can be pro-active.

POOL SEASON PASSES

Administration presented information on the approach over the last few years to decrease expenses and increase revenues at the pool. It was indicated strategies implemented over the last 3 years showed a decrease in the annual loss at the pool.

Council discussed a "senior punch card" option.
