



# Village of Stirling

October 19, 2016

The Village of Stirling Council meeting held at the Stirling Community Centre on October 19, 2016. In attendance Mayor Nilsson, Councillors Bikman, Edwards, Lewington (Joined via Internet Video) and Maynes and CAO Selk.

CALLED TO ORDER Mayor Nilsson called the meeting to order at 7:10 p.m.

RECOGNITION Council recognizes Senior Girls Volleyball team for going undefeated and winning the Strathmore Holly Cross Collegiate tournament.

Council recognizes Anne Fry and the Stirling Community Walking Club for all the work completing the outdoor exercise equipment area.

Council recognizes Shane Still and Public Works for the extra efforts supporting the special projects happening in the community including: outdoor exercise equipment installation, street oiling, calcium chloride application and helping the companies with the fiber internet installation.

Council recognizes Raymond R.C.M.P. for the prompt and professional response dealing with concerns at the campground and the quick arrest related to the attempted robbery at the local store.

Council recognizes the Stirling Fire Department and Chief Hodder for the prompt response to the recent structural fire and the for all the training and practice invested by all volunteers.

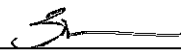
