2018-2021 ROAD REHABILITATION AND OILING PROGRAM Administration presented updated information on the 2018-2021 road rehabilitation program and a draft 4- year road rebuilding schedule.

Council discussed:

- Rebuilding of 8th Street and 1st Avenue with support from the County of Warner.
- The County has offered to put approximately \$100,000 of in-kind work for each of the perimeter roads, including manpower, machines, and base material. The Village would responsible for approximately \$77,000 in gravel and approximately \$130,000 in oil. The total cost to rebuild one road would be roughly \$315,000 (including rental equipment). 8th Street would be done on 2018, while 1st Avenue would be completed in 2019. The interior road rebuilding project would be done by the Village staff.
- The order of roads to be oiled and rebuilt is being taken into consideration.
- Council discussed Administration meeting with the County to discuss the donation in detail.

Mayor Lewington moved that the 2018-2019 Road Rehabilitation and Oiling Program be approved in principle and be it further resolved that Council directs Administration to clarify the allocation of in-kind support from The County of Warner in terms of 8th Street to the CPR right-of-way and in terms of the implications on negotiations for future Intermunicipal Collaboration Framework (ICF) and report back to Council.

RWSC AND VILLAGE OF STIRLING – RURAL WATER AGREEMENT

Administration reviewed the Rural Water Agreement with Ridge Water Services Commission.

Council discussed the agreement including clause 12: "Absence of Warranty".

Council directed Administration to seek clarification on clause 12 of the agreement.

FIRE CHIEF RESIGNATION

Mayor Lewington discussed the Letter of Resignation from Fire Chief Thomas Hodder. The Mayor noted the manys year of dedicated service Chief Hodder has provided to the community and highlighted many of his accomplishments. Lewington discussed the increase in the departments membership and assets over Hodder's the 5-year term as Chief. Fire Chief Hodder's last day will be July 9, 2018.

Mayor Lewington also discussed:

- The list of needed equipment vital to the continued operation of the Fire Department provided by Chief Hodder.
- One of the needed equipment is for new SCBA (self-contained breathing apparatus). The provincial standards require that firefighters have a minimum of seven SCBAs at the fire hall. These must be certified annually. The Stirling Volunteer Fire Department has been fortunate enough to have received previously used, certified SCBAs from Lethbridge in the past. Each new SCBA is \$8,549 a new set of 7 would cost roughly \$59,000.
- Would like to open communication with other Fire Stations about ideas on cost-sharing, equipment, administrative advice.

- Discussed the Town of Raymond recently hiring a parttime Fire Chief.
- Stirling Firefighter volunteers are invited to the Council Meeting on Wednesday, June 20, 2018 to discuss a recommendation from the Association for the new Fire Chief.

Council directed administration to write a memorandum to the Stirling Fire Department Association membership inviting them to be a delegation at the next Council meeting on June 20, 2018 and bring a recommendation to Council for a new Fire Chief.

RAW WATER INSTALLATION – RESIDENTIAL CONNECTIONS

Administration presented updated information on the raw water connections with the RID to the Cemetery and Fish Pond.

- The raw water connection has been approved for the fish pond.
- The raw water connection has been approved for the cemetery.
- Administration has met with adjacent property owner about the possibility to tie on to the raw water line for a fee plus a share of the installation cost.
- Cost determination in progress for the 2 possible connections and any other addition residential connection.

Council directed Administration to allow the tie in of residential properties where adequate supply is available and to work on an approach to cost share the cost of the mainline installation.

<u>STIRLING 2022</u> <u>STRATEGIC PLAN –</u> TIMELINE REVIEW

Council discussed the review process for the Stirling 2022 Strategic Plan.

Administration indicated the CAO report now includes a table for review.
