## The Village of Stirling is seeking applications for the following 2 positions: Seasonal Historical Preservation Worker / Interpreter (9 weeks)

These roles can be either full-time or part-time for the right candidate. Federal grant funding has allowed us to provide these 2 employment opportunities to support students who may have had their studies disrupted by COVID-19. Target start date of September/ October which is flexible. Contract is for 9 weeks.

To be eligible to apply please note that you must:

- Be a Canadian Citizen, permanent resident, or have refugee status in Canada (Legally Entitled to work in Canada)
- Be between the ages of 16 and 30 years of age at the start of employment
- Be a Full Time Student during the preceding academic semester (Spring 2020)
- Intend on returning to school next semester (January or September 2021)
- Have not participated in the Young Canada Works program for 3 or more years

## Duties will include:

- 1. Maintaining the Michelson Farmstead
- 2. Working with the library to preserve historical records
- 3. Working with the Village office and public works team to preserve historical records
- 4. Planning a community event
- 5. Marketing and social media support for the Village
- 6. Other duties as required
