We appreciate everyone's patience as we continue to navigate public health restrictions imposed by the province that are still subject to change before the event even takes place. In case you missed it, the Village was approved for grant funding from the Commemorative Partnership Program at Veterans Affairs Canada to complete a Cenotaph. This month Council initiated the process to renew our Franchise Agreement with ATCO. The 10 year agreement provides ATCO with the ability to use utility right of ways for their pipelines and infrastructure to supply natural gas to our community. Stirling has worked with ATCO since the 1950's to ensure reliable

natural gas service to our residents. A bylaw passed by Council is required to initiate the renewal process subject to approval by the Alberta Utility Commission.

Council also proposed a resolution to the fall conference of the Alberta Urban Municipalities Association (AUMA) to urge the Government of Alberta to allow municipalities to clearly communicate the newly imposed and increased costs of policing. Stirling's resolution, if adopted, will encourage the AUMA to lobby



the government to allow us to show the provincial requisitions for policing on property tax assessment notices. Council also appreciates the support of the Town of Magrath who seconded our resolution for submission to the AUMA.

Council also passed 3 rezoning bylaws this month after holding the required public hearings. Each bylaw was to reclassify a previously closed road allowance and clean up property title information for the impacted parcels. This process is necessary to allow future residential development on the newly created larger or consolidated parcels. Although largely administrative in nature, it is important for the Village to ensure all development matters follow proper government processes so there are no issues in the future.



There are many construction and road rehabilitation projects underway around the Village. Our public works team is working hard to make the most of the pleasant weather to get as many capital priorities completed as possible. Council appreciates the patience of residents as temporary detours may disrupt normal traffic patterns. Please remind children to avoid open excavations and construction zones.

Finally, let me say congratulations to this year's graduates of Stirling High School. You have successfully navigated another very challenging school year and adapted with grace to even more disrupted extra-curricular activities. As you look ahead to your summer, I hope you will think about all that you have learned in the classroom, in the lab, in the gym and in your community.
