Municipal Development Plan Community Input: Focus on Youth

> Summary Results October 2021



EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

In the Fall of 2021, the Village of Stirling disseminated the survey "Community Input: Focus on Youth" to attain feedback from the Village youth. The survey was dispersed to students in grades 9 and 12, and contained 11 questions designed to ascertain general attitudes and priorities for youth in the community.

The information contained in this summary document has been compiled from twenty-four (24) surveys: sixteen (16) responses from grade 9 students and eight (8) grade 12 students.

Initial Insights:

- Grade 9 and Grade 12 students value the 'small-town' atmosphere, and agree that Stirling is a safe, quiet community.
- Generally, students want to see more activities including: a dedicated skatepark, more recreation amenities and better pool hours.
- The biggest issues facing Stirling are the lack of services and employment, and growth of the Village.
- The ideal community for Grade 9 students includes more recreation facilities, an indoor pool and a skatepark. For Grade 12 students, the ideal community includes more restaurants and more retail options.
- The playground, library and sports fields are among the top-rated recreation facilities in Stirling.
- Students identified more options for grocery/convenience stores and a skatepark as businesses or services that would benefit the community.
- Most students participate in school-organized extracurricular activities. Some travel to Lethbridge for additional activities.
- The majority of Grade 9 and Grade 12 students agree that there are not enough activities for youth in Stirling.
 - Respondents indicated that they would like to see more 'unstructured' or leisure activities (i.e. skatepark, walking/hiking trails, basketball courts, etc.).\
- After graduation, most students intend to leave for schooling or employment opportunities.
 - Almost 50% of Grade 9 students indicated that they would like to return to Stirling to live.

1. What do you like most about living in the Village?


- I really like the fact that everything is relatively close together so you are not required to walk long distances

- Less people


2. What do you think would make Stirling a better place to live?




- Build a Wendys. More places to work ex. Wendys.


3. What do you feel is the most important issue facing Stirling in the future?

- If COVID lock downs happen again.





4. If you could plan the ideal community, what would it include?





- If I could plan the ideal community, it would have a skatepark a YMCA a big school with some stores to buy snacks from and a haunted mansion.





Grade 9 Responses:



- More restaurants, grocery store


- I think food restaurants would 100% benefit Stirling, more sports teams happening, skatepark, better running pool, basketball courts, volleyball courts, football fields, and many more.

What other activities for young people would you like to see in Stirling?




- More places to hangout. More businesses to go to. Going to wendys (you could put it by the yellow house).


9. Once you graduate, do you intend to:


