

Mayor's Monthly Message

May 2022

Canada is celebrating the Platinum Jubilee of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II, marking her 70th anniversary on the Throne. She is Canada's longest reigning Sovereign and the first to celebrate a platinum jubilee. June 2nd will mark the anniversary of Her Majesty's coronation. As part of Canada's recognition of the Jubilee, the Village of Stirling was fortunate to receive a grant of \$5,000 to be used



towards community events. Regardless of your opinion about Canada's form of constitutional monarchy, there is something inspirational about 70 years of public service.



You may have noticed new homes being built and an increase of other development activity happening in the Village as you drive around. So far this year we have seen 10 development applications including 4 new homes and 1 home addition. That's the same level of activity in the first 4 months of this year as all of 2021. (There were a total of 10 development applications all last year.) A combination of steady sustainable growth and in-fill

development is very important for the long-term financial health of the Village and local businesses. If you have questions about development and building permits, please contact the Village office.

Council was able to meet with Robin Hepher this month who is the CEO of the Chinook Arch Regional Library System. Stirling is part of the regional library system which provides our library with access to the collections of all participating libraries in the network. Stirling is actually a net lender to the system. That means that more people outside of Stirling borrow books from our library than we, in turn, borrow from the regional system. This is a good sign in that our library maintains a collection that is in demand. Big thanks to Laura Quinton and the whole library team for their hard work ensuring exciting programming and a welcoming space. Have you seen what is available in your library lately?
