





TECHNOLOGY UPDATES	We have made a change from Vector Solutions as they were unable to meet our needs. We are working with First Due to cover full administration functions, training hours & certifications, inventory & asset management, responder notification, incident pre-planning & building inspections.
GEAR UPDATES	We have ordered the 2024 gear, 5 sets of bunker gear, early to ensure we received last years prices before the mark up. Gear should be arriving before the end of January.
INCIDENT CALLS	2023 we had a total of 105 incident calls, this was comparable to 2022 in volume. We did see a slight rise in medical events within the village while county and highway calls still remained comparable.
