

It was exciting to be able to provide two deserving graduates of the Stirling School with the Ridge Utilities 125th Anniversary Scholarship. Kirsten Rondeau and Will Selk each received \$1,250 from Ridge Utilities to assist them in their future studies. Thank you to everyone who has chosen to buy electricity and natural gas from Ridge and help us reinvest into community projects.





The Government of Alberta asked municipalities to deliver a 5 to 10% reduction in water use over the year as part of a combined effort to tackle drought conditions across the province. I'm pleased to report that as of the end of June, that we collectively as a community, had used 99,379 cubic meters of water as compared to 115,703 for the same time last year. A total reduction of 14.1% exceeding the provincial target. Thank you for your efforts to use water more efficiently.

It's been hard to watch the devastating scenes coming out of Jasper. A raw reminder of the importance of emergency preparedness for every household.

My gratitude for Andre Thibaudeau and Domanick Mrak from the Stirling Fire Department for their willingness to answer the call from the Alberta Emergency Management Agency and be deployed to northern Alberta with 2 volunteers from Nobleford's department.
