

Mayor's Monthly Message

May 2019

Council continued discussions this month regarding the 2019 Tax Rate Bylaw and the final budget for the fiscal year. All residents should have now received their tax notice and property assessment in the mail. If you did not receive your tax notice or you believe there is an error, please contact the Village office as soon as possible. Property taxes are due in full by June 30th or late payment penalties are applied. (Note that this does not impact residents who are set-up on preauthorized automatic payments.)
