Stirling was one of the first communities in the region to participate in the Southwest Alberta Blackfoot Signage Project. Grants were made available from Community Futures Lethbridge Region and the SouthGrow Regional Initiative to fund the signage. As we celebrate Stirling's 125th year, we were pleased this month to formally acknowledge our Blackfoot name of Omahksikimii Itaikkiakiop or "Lake where we trap" on each of the entrance signs to the Village. (Pronounced oomah-gsi-gim-me, e-deck-gea-geoup. The hard g's sound the same as in "get" not "general".) Stirling will receive up to \$2.5 million for upgrades to our potable water reservoir and distribution systems under the Alberta Municipal Water / Wastewater program (AMWWP). This new funding is in addition to almost \$2.2 million received in 2023 under the program to support improvements to the Village's lift station and sewer force mains. Funding over the last two years unlocks a total investment of almost \$6 million in our core infrastructure to ensure reliable services for current residents and support future growth as we map out our future. We are grateful for the Government of Alberta's continued strategic investment in that future. (Pictured with myself is Taber Warner MLA, Hon. Grant Hunter for the media event.)
